Some audition may be required. Private instruction is recommended for all students. Regular outside of class performances will be a part of class requirements Membership in the Symphonic Band is by audition and/or director's recommendation. Those accepted have the ability to play more difficult literature, including all styles from classical to pop. The directors will assign students to this ensemble after they have met the requirements, within the parameters of available chairs. Instrumentation will be limited to wind ensemble size. Private instruction is encouraged and expected of all members. Regular outside of class performances will be a part of course requirements
