#### Signing into Your PowerPTC Account

- Open a web browser and navigate to: https://ps1.morton709.org/public
- If you have a PowerSchool <u>Parent</u> account, log into it and skip to #6 below.
   (If you forgot your password, email <u>powerschool@mcusd709.org</u> and asked to have it reset.)
- 3. If you don't have a PowerSchool Parent account:
  - Call the MHS office at 309-284-6025
  - b. Ask for your child's Access ID & Password
- Click the Create Account tab and create your parent account. Link your child to your account using their Access ID and Access Password.
- Sign into account.
- 6. In the upper right corner, click on this icon



- 7. Under Applications, click on PowerPTC.
- 8. Click Guardians & Parents-Click Here to Login

#### **Scheduling Your Conferences**

- Click on Conference Schedule.
- Select the date you would like to schedule your appointments on.
- 3. Select a starting **time** for your appointments.
- If you would **not** like to attend conferences with certain courses, uncheck the box under the **Schedule** column.

- Finally, click Print Schedule to create a hard copy of your parent-teacher conference schedule.

All Juniors will be taking the SAT after spring break 2020. Morton High School will be offering a review for this assessment in mid-late March. This review is designed to prepare Junior students for the SAT. These sessions are from 6:00 - 9:00 p.m. on March 16, 23, 26, and 30. Each session will have a focus - reading, writing, language, SAT essay, math, and science. The cost for all 3 nights is \$75. This covers the book, materials, and instructors.

Extracurricular activities and/or work often conflict with the start times of these sessions. Please do not let this prevent you from registering if you see a need for the classes. Students are allowed in late due to these circumstances.

Registration in December is a 2 step process: 1) Make your payment through <u>EFUNDS</u> in December 2) Complete a google form. The Google Form will be shared through email in December.

The registration process opens in December and must be paid before <a href="Thursday">Thursday</a>, February 6th. This firm deadline ensures book delivery and hiring of personnel for the first session.

# Armed Forces Recruiter Access to Students and Student Recruiting Information

With the passing of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), Pub. L. 114-95, signed by President Obama in 2015, Congress amended the "Armed Forces Recruiter Access to Students and Student Recruiting Information." This amendment entitles military recruiters, upon request, the right to receive the name, address, and telephone listing of secondary school students served by that school, unless the parent of such student (or a secondary school student who has reached 18 years of age) has submitted a written request to the school to opt out of such a disclosure. Military recruiters routinely request this information only on juniors and seniors in high school.

ESSA requires schools to notify parents and students that military recruiters will have equal access to their directory information unless the students opt out in writing. Parents and students must actively opt out of this provision in writing. A passive opt out is not sufficient. If you would like to opt out, please provide a written statement with parent/guardian signature to the Counseling Office.

### **FAFSA Completion Workshops at MHS with ISAC:**

During Parent-Teacher Conferences on Thursday, October 17 from 5-7PM (Room 40) and Friday, October 18 from 8-10AM (Room 40), a financial aid specialist will be on campus to assist parents/guardians and students as you complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online. *All students, regardless of income, should complete the FAFSA each year.* The FAFSA window opens annually on October 1st. It is strongly encouraged that you complete the FAFSA as soon as you are able. The FAFSA will use your 2018 tax documents. Please register for the workshop here:
