Thursday, July 30th: Registration day!

- This process will begin in the fover of the main office off Illinois Ave.
- You have several options when paying your student registration and outstanding fees:
 - Skip the lines and pay your school fees online!
 - You can <u>pay online</u> with EFUNDS anytime after July 1, through the district website (<u>www.morton709.org</u>) located on the red bar which runs across the bottom of the webpage. Please be aware that there is a fee for debit/credit card use. However, there is no charge for using your checking account.
 - You can <u>mail</u> your registration fees to Morton High School, 350 N. Illinois Ave., Morton, IL 61550. Please make checks payable to Morton Unit District #709. Please include the Student Fee Summary with your check.
 - o Pay in person in the main office of MHS weekdays from 7:00 AM 3:00 PM
 - Pay at registration on July 30th, from 7:00 AM 5:00 PM.
- Fee waiver applications will be available at registration.
- Free/reduced lunch applications will be available at registration, or you may apply online, after **July 10th**, at https://lunchapp.com/.
- If you choose to pay before registration day, you do not need to come in on July 30th.
- If you wish to speak to a counselor we suggest you make an appointment.
- Parking passes will be distributed on Registration day in Student Services, **if** you have paid for one. If you don't pick up your parking pass it will be mailed to you.
- <u>Textbooks will not be distributed on Registration</u>. Books will be distributed during the first week of school by class.

At the time you pay registration/technology fees with Efunds or with a check, you may also purchase a 2021 yearbook (\$50.00), MHS PTO membership (\$10.00), and Athletic Booster membership (\$15.00). At this time, we have decided to hold off on the sale of Athletic Season Passes since we are unsure when IHSA will allow spectators in the stands.

If your address has changed over the summer, you will need to bring in **proof of residency** at registration.

Powerschool access will be given to parents and students on Wednesday, July 29th.

RE: IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS FOR 12TH GRADE

Dear Parents:

Illinois law requires that all students 6^{th} and $\underline{12}^{th}$ grade must have a meningococcal vaccine (MCV4).

- 6th graders must receive one dose on or after the 11th birthday
- 12th graders must receive two doses; the second dose must be after the 16th birthday. If the first dose is received at 16 years of age or older, only 1 dose is required.

We will need verification that your son/daughter has received this immunization. Documentation accepted as complying with the requirement includes the following information:

- Note or letter, signed by health care provider and identifying the vaccine (MCV4) and date (month, day, and year) administered.
- Print-out from provider's electronic medical record system that identifies MCV4 vaccination and date administered for student in question.
- Current Certificate of Child Health Examination (see link below), specifying MCV4 and date (month, day, year) administered. http://files.morton709.org/district/forms/ChildHealthExamination.pdf

In addition to health care providers, many local health departments, and pharmacies offer the vaccine. The Illinois Department of Public Health recommends that parents get their students immunized now to avoid last-minute rush during the summer. Students without adequate proof of vaccination will be *subject to exclusion* as described in the School Code of Illinois on Oct. 15, 2020.

Deidre Ripka, Principal Morton High School Dear Parents of Morton High School incoming 9th graders:

Enclosed you will find the 9th grade physical form to be used for all incoming freshman and new students. We will not accept a sports physical for the 9th grade school physical. You may use the enclosed physical form for both school and sports for 9th graders only. It is very important to make sure all parts of this form are complete. It is your responsibility to fill out the **Health History** section and **sign it** for this form to be accepted.

Physicals are good for **13 months** from the date of exam for athletic purposes.

Each child must be protected against preventable childhood diseases with immunizations according to the State of Illinois School Regulations. The specific date of all immunizations must be recorded on the child's exam record. Parents have the right to refuse immunizations for their children for religious reasons by submitting the *Illinois Certificate of Religious Exemption* form filled out and signed by the parent/guardian **and** health care provider. Physician's signature is required for medical exemption.

Your private physician will be able to provide immunizations along with many pharmacies and the Tazewell County Health Dept.

Your compliance will assist the schools in cooperation with the State Health Department in complying with State Law designed to enhance the well-being and health of all school children as well as your own. Students without adequate proof of physicals and immunizations will be subject to exclusion as described in the School Code of Illinois on Oct. 15, 2020.
