



#### **Honors/Standard placement is determined by:**

- 1. Junior High teacher observation
- 2. Junior High grades
- 3. Cumulative exams and standardized test (PSAT 8)
- 4. Student and parent/guardian request
- 5. Student post high school goals
- 6. Holistic data review with MHS Counselor

#### **Honors v Standard? What's the difference?**

- Standard and Honors classes at MHS are college and career preparatory.
- Honors courses higher level, faster pace, expanded content, less built in review time, less built in homework time, assessments outweigh homework grades, and most have a research component
  - Please see the teachers in the curriculum fair in the East Gym for details.
- Honors classes earn weighted grade points
  - MHS has a 4.0 scale
  - Honors classes make it possible for a student to earn above a 4.0 on a 4.0 scale

Register for the classes best fit for the student now and assess\ each year.

#### **Driver's Education**

- Scheduling Driver's Education is based solely on birthdates
  - Tentative S1: 1/2/07 4/19/07
  - **Tentative** S2: 4/20/07 9/7/07
- If you are eligible for Summer DE, please plan to take it at that time
  - **Tentative** Summer 2023: 9/8/07 11/13/07

#### **Driver's Education**

- Requirements to take Driver's Education at MHS
  - Must pass 8 courses during the previous 2 semesters, PE does NOT count as one of these 8 courses

- Must have a study hall or PE the semester you are enrolled in DE to allow for driving time
- Parent Obligation: 50 hours of driving time

#### **Grading System**

$$85 - 92 = B$$

$$77 - 84 = C$$

Note: Any F (below 70) grade for a semester means NO CREDIT is given for that course.

- The semester grade is calculated:
  - $\circ$  1<sup>st</sup> quarter = 40%
  - $\circ$  2<sup>nd</sup> quarter = 40%
  - Semester exam = 20%
- Only Semester 1 and Semester 2 grades appear on a transcript (not quarter grades)

#### **Driver's Education FAQs**

- Learner's Permit Issued 30 days prior to the 1st day of DE class
- Enrollment Dates are tentative Spots may open up
- Summer School Option 40 available spots
  - Begins 1st day of summer
  - Ends 2nd week of July
  - Only Two (2) absences allowed
