**Profile of school and community:**

Morton High School is a comprehensive 4-year high school serving students in the communities of Morton and Groveland. These communities encourage academic excellence, as well as support the fine arts and athletics. Along with the high school, the entire school district is composed of four elementary schools and one junior high. Several private and parochial schools feed into Morton High School.

**Curriculum:**

With over 150 courses available to Morton High School students, they are afforded the luxuries of a large school in a setting that allows for individualized help and an academically oriented environment. Of these classes, 28 are Honors Level and must go through a rigorous auditing process every 5 years. Dual credit classes offered at Morton High School through Illinois Central College are Advanced Speech, Earth Science/Intro to Geology-H, Economics, Expository Writing-H, Introduction to Astronomy-H, Music Theory, Principles of Nutrition, Blueprint Reading for Welding, Stick Welding Theory & Practice, and MIG Welding. We offer the following Advanced Placement courses: AP Biology-H, AP Calculus AB-H, AP Computer Science Principles-H, AP Computer Science A-H, AP Physics-H, AP Psychology, AP Spanish 4-H, AP Statistics-H, and AP French 4-H. The following course is AP and dual credit: AP Chemistry-Honors. Morton High School has seven class periods per day, 46 minutes per period.

Morton High School is recognized as one of the state leaders in the Project Lead the Way curriculum. This pre-engineering program was established to assist schools in developing students with the knowledge needed to succeed in engineering and technology-based careers. Currently, Morton High School has one certified teacher and offers 4 classes: Introduction to Engineering Design-H, Digital Electronics, Civil Engineering and Architecture, and Principles of Engineering. These courses are noted on the transcript with a PLTW.
